

Travel Assessment Form for Immunisations

Please note that it can take up to 10 working days for the Nurse to review and collate the relevant information. You will be contacted by the Practice once the form has been completed by the Nurse. No advice will be given unless this form is completed.

From December 2010 certain travel immunisations were made no longer available on the NHS which means there is now a fee for the prescription and private appointment with the Nurse payable to the surgery.

IF AN APPOINTMENT / PRESCRIPTION(S) ARE REQUIRED PAYMENT MUST BE MADE ON COLLECTION FROM SURGERY. Please note payment must be made by either cash or cheque.

If you do require immunisations for your foreign travel, you will need to pick up your prescription from the surgery **and you may need to** make an appointment with the Nurse. You must then take your prescription down to the chemist in case they need to order in the injections for you. On the day of your appointment, you must collect your injection(s) from the Chemist prior to your appointment with the Nurse.
